This tune is attributed to Turlough O'Carolan, a blind Irish harper who was one of the lat Irish harpers to compose music for wealthy patrons with whom he would stay throughout his travels in Ireland. Born in 1670, he was blinded by smallpox at the age of 18. He was already showing promise as a poet, and after three years of study on the harp he began his career as an itenerant harper. He died in 1738 and his funeral was widely attended. In an appropriate tribute to the man, his wake lasted four days.

A significant number of his works are preserved in single line melody... The Complete Works of O'Carolan includes this melody.

The atypical harmonization in this setting produces a transparent quality which transcends time and reality.
